A restaurant owner has been jailed for six years for the manslaughter of a customer who had an allergic reaction to a curry. Mr Richard Wright QC, who prosecuted this 'landmark case' will join delegates to give an overview of the circumstances leading up to this case, the current regulations and what the outcome means for food businesses.
